# 4 - MATTERS ARISING

- (1)(5.1) SSEN Fund- Mr Flockhart has been working on a document to be signed by borrowers. On hold at the moment. Decided to see if we could ascertain who might be in need of help during power cuts etc. Perhaps, mention in the next Newsey. Can only help approx. 38/40. Could residents sign up to SP Energy Networks Free Priority Services Register?
- (2)(5.2) Hedge at ST Ternan's Hedge has been removed and replaced with a fence. A great improvement.
- (3)(5.5) Bin uplifts Councillor Victor has confirmed problems are caused due to lorry break downs.
- (4)(5.9) Platinum Jubilee Path Mr Jones has forwarded a letter of support from Newtonhill, Muchalls and Cammachmore Community Council. Coastal Path update The Tangleha Artists Collective has been tasked with developing the path from the River North Esk to the southern edge of Aberdeen City limits at Cove. Should then link up with paths round Aberdeen City, Aberdeenshire and Banffshire. Working on a path from Stonehaven to Bridge of Muchalls. No access through the Golf Course.
- (5)(13.2) Newtonhill Festive Lights Councillor Sullivan will take this forward. Letter of support to be sent to her.

There was also discussion re the lighting up of feature wall at entrance to Newtonhill. Mr Torrance felt this was unnecessary - not a road sign, additional lighting is not good, costs money and we are heading for a climate catastrophe. However, it was decided by a majority to see what lighting up the feature would involve.

- (6)(13.3) Seed potatoes Can't carry out a give-away on a week-day evening. A seed hub will be put into Portlethen Library from mid-April where anyone can collect free seeds. Seed potatoes can also be collected from the Haven, Stonehaven, on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2024, 10am.
- 5 PLANNING (a) Aberdeenshire LDP Evidence Report Topic Papers and Local Heat and Energy Efficiency Strategy. Three more Evidence reports have been completed including one on tourism. Will be included in Local Place Plan, (b) Planning application for erection of dwelling house on land to the east of Skateraw Store. Mr Morgan has raised our concerns, esp regarding buses, (c) Site at Roadside Cammachmore 5 pitch motor home stop over.

- 6 ROADS and POTHOLES (a) Someone, presumably Amey, has been working on the main road over a couple of nights. Supposedly going to check out potholes at entrance to Muchalls, (b) Lights at zebra crossing according to Aberdeenshire Council fault should be reported online but this can't actually be done. (Repairs have been carried out).
- 7 UNDERPASS No further updates. Ms Samarakoon later commented that there needs to be a tidy up of underpass bottles, cans, litter etc. There needs to be proper access for wheelchairs and cycles. Mr Flockhart to see if Amey can provide any help.
- 8 ELSICK BRIDGE Safety fencing at the non-existent bridge has 'blown down'. When will it be replaced/properly fixed? Councillor Sullivan thinks it has been removed.
- 10 BIINOCULARS/TELESCOPE Now in position at the Braehead thanks to work carried out by Aberdeenshire Council workmen. Mr Jones has contacted Diane Henderson, Aberdeenshire Council, to confirm work has been concluded.
- 11 FEATURE WALLS at MUCHALLS and CAMMACHMORE Article will appear in the next Muchalls newsletter asking for design for the feature wall for Muchalls. Mr Connolly will deal with the one at Cammachmore. Mark McDonald is quite happy to undertake the work but cannot give quote until he receives further information. Sites, design, planning permission. Quotes would all be needed before grants can be applied for.
- 12 COMMUNITY COUNCIL INSURANCE Awaiting confirmation from Zurich that the Newtonhill Christmas lights, Isabella and binoculars/telescope are included in insurance.
