NEWTONHILL, MUCHALLS and CAMMACHMORE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The 373rd meeting of Newtonhill, Muchalls and Cammachmore Community Council took place in the Skateraw Hall, Newtonhill at 7.30pm on Wednesday 15th May 2024.

Mr Flockhart welcomed all and thanked them for attending.

- 1 APOLOGIES Gillian Davidson, Punya Samarakoon, Cllrs Sullivan and Victor.
- 2 POLICE REPORT Written report received. We are included in the Stonehaven Area. Youth disorder 6; anti-social 23; thefts one under investigation; shopliftings 2 under investigation, one detected; drink/drug driving one detected; dangerous driving 2 detected; careless driving one detected. Container fire at Newtonhill A group of youths has been traced and charged BUT why no mention in Police Report? Damage at Park and Choose Bus Shelter reported to Police Scotland and Aberdeenshire Council. Apparently, there was also trouble at the Bowling Club on Saturday night caused by a group of youths.

- 4 MATTERS ARISING
- (1)(4.1) SSEN Mr Flockhart has made some purchases wind up radios, torches, chargers, blankets, flasks. Storage containers to be purchased. £1,300 still left.
- (2)(4.5) Dropped kerbs Mr Flockhart has contacted Aberdeenshire Council again. This will, hopefully, be discussed at a Council meeting on 21st May 2024.
- (3)(4.6) Cut down bushes at East Cammachmore. This appears to have been done by residents. Suggested they be asked to shift cuttings to the side.
- (4)(4.7) Tennis Courts No update.
- (5)(4,8) Portlethen Medical Centre Mr Flockhart has an update meeting on Monday; The new online booking system starts on Monday.
- (6)(4.16) Conservation Status for Muchalls This will be raised at AGM at the end of May. Miss Daniels indicated most people she had spoken to were in favour of retaining Conservation Status.
- (8)(13.4) School Rolls Mr Morgan fears there will be a crisis with secondary education in the very near future as Banchory, Portlethen and Mackie Academies are all reaching maximum numbers.

Mr Morgan has received a response from Kelly Tennant.

- (1) No budget available for capital works. Some minor changes made which support capacity,
- (2) S1 admittance levels have been set for 2024/2025.

All out of zone's admittance to Portlethen Academy have been refused,

(3) The new housing at Chapelton is one of the main causes of increase in pupil numbers. Academy catchment areas will be reviewed in line with new school at Chapelton.

Mr Jones has concerns re pupils attending the Mackie Academy as he feels it is in need of upgrading or replaced.

- 6 LOCAL PLACE PLAN A work in progress Will need to be completed by September.
- 7– ROADS and POTHOLES (1) When will white lines be repainted at Newtonhill zebra crossings? (2) Water on the A92 northbound opposite Nethermains Farm, (3) Potholes on the service road to the Bettridge Centre., (4) Zig Zag lines at TESCO No information on current timing but on the to do list., (5) With regards to the road from Old Mill Road towards the Bettridge Centre, bowling green and old library, according to the R I Comms Team, they suspect that Property Services maintain this area and we are awaiting a response from them.
- 8 UNDERPASS Still waiting for it to be put to public consultation.
- 9 ELSICK BRIDGE Meeting on Thursday 16th May 2024. It was felt a meeting is needed with Aberdeenshire Council to discuss the way forward. Tim Stephens to be invited to attend a Community Council meeting.
- 10 FEATURE WALLS Mr Flockhart has been making enquiries re possible solar lighting for Newtonhill Wall.

Report from Mr Connolly re Cammachmore Wall – The School has been approached for designs. Aberdeenshire Estates has been approached to see who owns the land at the south entrance to Cammachmore where it is proposed to site the Wall. No price from Mark McDonald. Need to consider the proposed re-opening of the underpass when deciding where to place the Wall.

Punya has spoken to 28 residents and they are all in favour of a Wall.

She also once again raised the problems of potholes in Cammachmore

Muchalls has a design. It would be on a single stone to be situated at the top of Dunnyfell Road. One verbal estimate has been received. Now need to go for planning permission.

- 11 COMMUNITY COUNCIL INSURANCE Zurich have confirmed receipt of payment (£157.50)
- 12 FINANCE REPORT £6.400 in total in the bank. Muchalls and Cammachmore each have £1,450 to go towards purchase of feature wall.

It was agreed to give a donation of £100 to the Newsey.
