#### **DRAFT MINUTE**

- 1 APOLOGIES Mr Chew, Mr Cruickshank, Cllr Sullivan.
- 2 POLICE REPORT Written Report submitted for September. Youth disorder 4; anti-social 15; thefts 1 under investigation; shoplifting 7 under investigation; house breaking 2 under investigation; careless driving 4 detected; drink/drug driving 5 detected; dangerous driving 1 detected.

SCOTTISH FIRE and RESCUE and POLICE SCOTLAND are holding a Breakfast Club at Stonehaven Fire Station on October 15, 16, 17, 22, 23, and 24 from 9am to 11am.

- 4 MATTERS ARISING
- (1)(4.1) Dropped kerbs will be done 2025/2026
- (2)(4.2) Portlethen Medical Centre 3 weeks ago Mr Flockhart emailed Portlethen Health Centre re some patients receiving double dose prescriptions. No response so handed in paper copy. Now has had a response. Nothing can be done unless patients' details are revealed which they are not prepared to do.
- (3)(4.3) Community Council Get-together No further information.
- (4)(4.4) Japanese Knotweed Under control in the meantime.
- (5)(15.1) Article for the Newsey Miss Daniels working on this. Reminder emergency packs available. At this point Mr Flockhart showed a booklet giving advice on what to do in emergencies, eg power cuts and winter weather which has been produced by Torphins. Could Newtonhill, Muchalls and Cammachmore Community Council do something similar? SSEN funding could be used to produce this. Every household would have one delivered.

The Bettridge Centre is about to have solar panels installed. Would this mean the Centre would be self-sufficient? Could it be used as a hub in emergencies? Could it be a 24 hour emergency hub?

Also, something else to be considered is how, if there is a problem on the A92, the road automatically closes at Newtonhill despite the fact the road to Muchalls is clear.

- (6)(15.2) Cammies Fiesta 300 plus attended. Some vendors not too happy but overall was a good day.
- (7)(15.5) Path to Muchalls beach This was discussed at last week's MVA meeting. Hopefully some vegetation will be cut back in the near future. Don't know who would be responsible for erection of fencing.
- 5 PLANNING No formal objection but CC will support Muchalls' decision re planning application for house next to Parkend, Marine Terrace.

6 – LOCAL PLACE PLAN and 7 - LDP - Mr Morgan has forwarded an updated draft Local Place Plan to members. It was decided to adopt the draft Local Place Plan which will now be forwarded to other Community Councils in the Area and the 4 Local Councillors. It will also appear on Facebook and CC website

It was also decided not to withdraw our objection to the Flooding Topic Paper.

8– ROADS and POTHOLES – Mr Flockhart continues to press Aberdeenshire Council for updates on road repairs – (1) Problems with build -up of sand etc at Cammachmore. Drains have been cleared but not the gutters. Who is responsible? AMEY or Aberdeenshire Council? (2) Reports of works being completed but haven't actually been done – pothole in Chapel Road. (3) Who owns the road from Newtonhill Road to the Bettridge Centre? Who is responsible for upkeep? Roads and Infrastructure Services Communication Team –They have sent a quote to Landscape Services to carry out repairs as this is their responsibility, (4) Several works supposedly complete – overgrowing trees and vegetation at TESCO (think this has now been done), overgrowing trees and vegetation at Elsick Place and St Michael's Road, (5) Gully smell at Elsick Place.

Any misinformation appears to have been caused by a computer glitch!

Other works will be carried out 2025/2026.

9 – UNDERPASS – Copy of Newtonhill to Cammachmore Pedestrian Link paper has been received. This will be circulated to Community Councillors. Feed back needed from land owners. The Scottish Government has just released a £10,000,000 fund for active travel between communities. This project would fit the bill.

10 – TENNIS COURTS - Mr Morgan has contacted Aberdeenshire Council with a list of problems including fence/fence posts, one net and supporting posts, netball stands

Aberdeenshire Council lease most of the recreational ground in Newtonhill so do we assume they should be responsible for upkeep? Appears there is no available budget for repairs. Developer Obligations do not cover repairs but would cover things like Pickleball. Unfortunately, it would appear residents would like the area to remain as it is (but with repairs) ie tennis, netball and basketball.

Aberdeenshire Council are pushing for funds to replace the fence as this has now become a Health and Safety issue.

Any suggestions for funding would be more than welcome.

Mr Morgan to get estimates for repairs and then we will take it from there.

11 – ELSICK BRIDGE – Official opening. No further developments.

12 – FEATURE WALLS

Planning applications have been submitted for both Muchalls and Cammachmore

Mr Connolly has submitted an application to Meikle Carewe for funding for Cammachmore.

Mr Connolly will have to be asked if he wishes to be co-opted on to Community Council again.

13 – FINANCE REPORT – At the moment £4.686. Should receive Community Council grant in the near future.
