## 5 - MATTERS ARISING

- (1)(4) Paul Macari No update on fire break at the Barratts Development.
- (2)(6.4) Men's Shed Councillors voted to approve the purchase of the old social work building, Portlethen, via CAT to be used as the new Portlethen and Area Men's Shed for £100. It will now go forward to the next meeting.
- (3)(6.5) Plants There is an area at Portlethen allotments that NEAT could use but have decided against it. The current proposal for plants in communities is to change from annuals to perennials.
- (4)(19.4) Newtonhill Library Library Service has requested costings for new signage. However, due to financial constraints it is not currently possible to purchase new signs. NVA is to put signs in the old library to point people in the direction of new library provision in the Bettridge Centre.
- (5)(19.5) Grit bins Removal of grit bins on hold at the moment.
- (6)(19.7) Newtonhill noticeboard The noticeboard has been erected but no map problems with printing. There have been several comments that where it has been positioned is a danger to children on bikes and scooters. Mr Jones to contact Aberdeenshire Council.

(7)(19.14) Rubble at Crollshillock – This arose after work was being carried out on the replacing of gas pipes. This has been tidied up and it would appear tidying up goes on as work is being carried out.

At this point Mr Jones pointed out there could be chaos with no parking on roads being worked on. Not sure what can be done esp as buses need to get through.

(8)(19.16) Chapelton lorry. – There has been a site visit and the matter is being investigated

6 – PLANNING – (1) Planning application for Wester Chapelton has now been withdrawn, 025-2035, (2) Have your say on AHSCP Draft Strategic Plan 2. Consultation open 8<sup>th</sup> September to 26<sup>th</sup> October 2025. If anyone has any comments, can they send them to Mr Morgan for discussion at the next meeting, (3) Aspen Wind Farm – application deals more with the actual wind farm than where it will come to land, (4) No update on solar panels.

7 – CHAPELTON – Healthcare facilities - NKRCC has contacted ClIr Alison Evison re healthcare or perhaps lack of healthcare at Chapelton.

Mr Morgan has sent a detailed email to Cllr Alison Evison regarding the proposed closure of the X-Ray department at Stonehaven Community Hospital. Reply from Cllr Evison explains X-Ray was installed in 1998 and now has an end-of-life notification (February 2026) As it is only used part-time, it will not be replaced. This means that patients will now have to travel to Aberdeen. A mobile X-Ray unit could be a possibility.

Mr Morgan is to follow this up. Concerns were raised regarding the future of Stonehaven Community Hospital esp as there is a renal unit based there.

8 - ROADS and POTHOLES – (1) Cammachmore pavements and potholes – Aberdeenshire Council will liaise with Amey re potholes as they are close to the A92. 2 different complaints re footpath vegetation. One should be rectified by 1/5/2026, the other has a competition date of 25/10/2025. Although the owner may be required to cut back the vegetation.

9 - FINANCE REPORT - Cash in bank £4,491.

Still waiting for audited accounts.

Community Council Grants – Usually receive a grant on the basis of a set amount per person in the Area. Going forward Community Councils will have to justify the amount received. We will discuss again at the next meeting but we ask that members suggest what we claim for. Are we really expected to note every mile travelled, every phone call and how long it lasts?

10 – FEATURE WALLS– Grant from Meikle Carewe has been handed back. Mr Connolly has also informed Glenrock and Mark McDonald that the project is on hold at the moment. Mr Flockhart has arranged for our meeting on March 18<sup>th</sup> 2026 to be held in Cammies. This will give

Cammachmore residents time to discuss what they would like for Cammachmore in place of the Stone at the south entrance.

- 11 TENNIS COURTS It would appear both Community Council and NVA have been working on repairs/upgrade of tennis courts. Report from NVA meeting attended by Mr Flockhart Tennis courts can be made good but a pickle ball court would replace a tennis court. Aberdeenshire Council should repair the fence on the grounds of safety. Basketball hoops and netball posts will not be replaced NVA are trying for grants to upgrade the tennis courts.

- 13 UNDERPASS Aberdeenshire Council has appointed a new Active Travel Infrastructure Coordinator who will now lead this with a further study before handing a full brief to Transport Scotland next year,

Engineer in charge of design maintains further technical study is needed as it is situated close to trunk road. Reports should be finished by March 2026 and then they will be forwarded to Transport Scotland.

15 – JUBILEE COASTAL PATH – (1) The final clearance of the gorse and undergrowth around Cranhill has been completed, (2) Update on the Jubilee path has been received.

8 – Disturbance in St Michael's Road - A gentleman parked on the dropped kerb at the School and despite children asking him to move, he refused and continued to park. Mr Torrance has reported to Sarah Chew, Chair of FON. Greater co-operation is needed between the School and some parents.

Could Community Council "adopt" a lane near the School which would provide a safer access to School. Would need to find out first who owns the lane and take it from there.

- 9 Mr Torrance has spoken to Audrey Nicoll, MSP, regarding a fast link between Newtonhill and Portlethen. This would be an active travel route which would run parallel to the railway line. This will involve National Rail Scotland. Hopefully, a feasibility study will be carried out in the near future.
- 10 The sub-group needs to have a meeting to discuss the way forward with what needs to be done re upgrading the path round Cranhill and possible contractors. Hopefully an update will be in place for the next meeting.
- 11 Mr Slessor took issue with report in minute 385 of what allegedly happened at the NVA meeting attended by Mr Flockhart.
